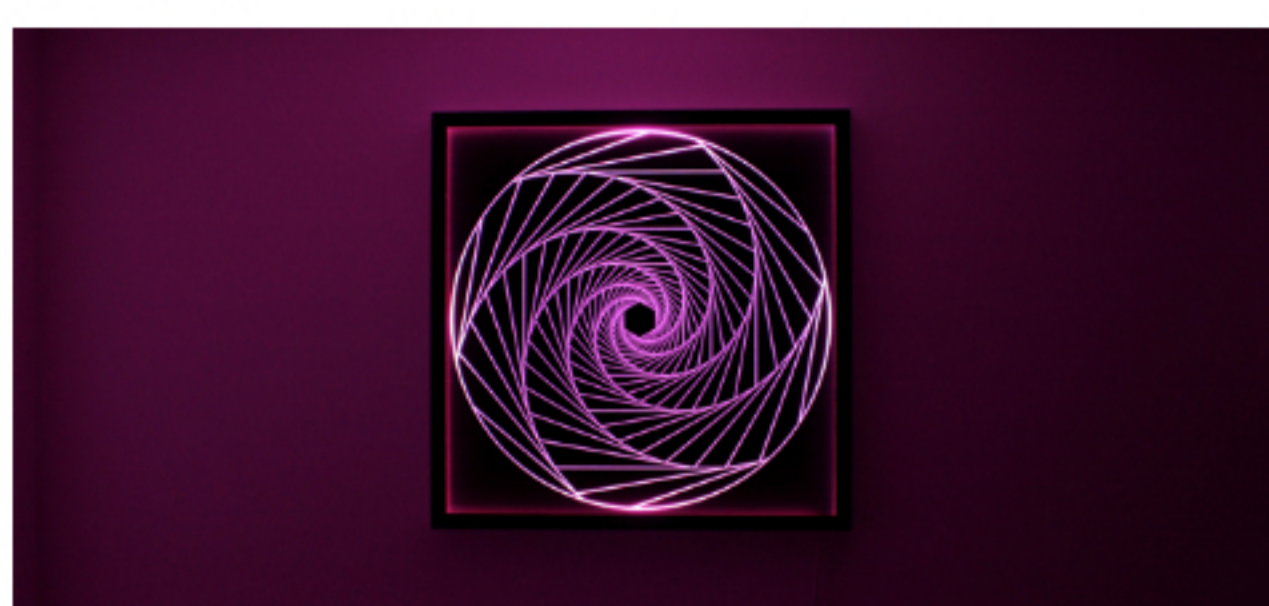
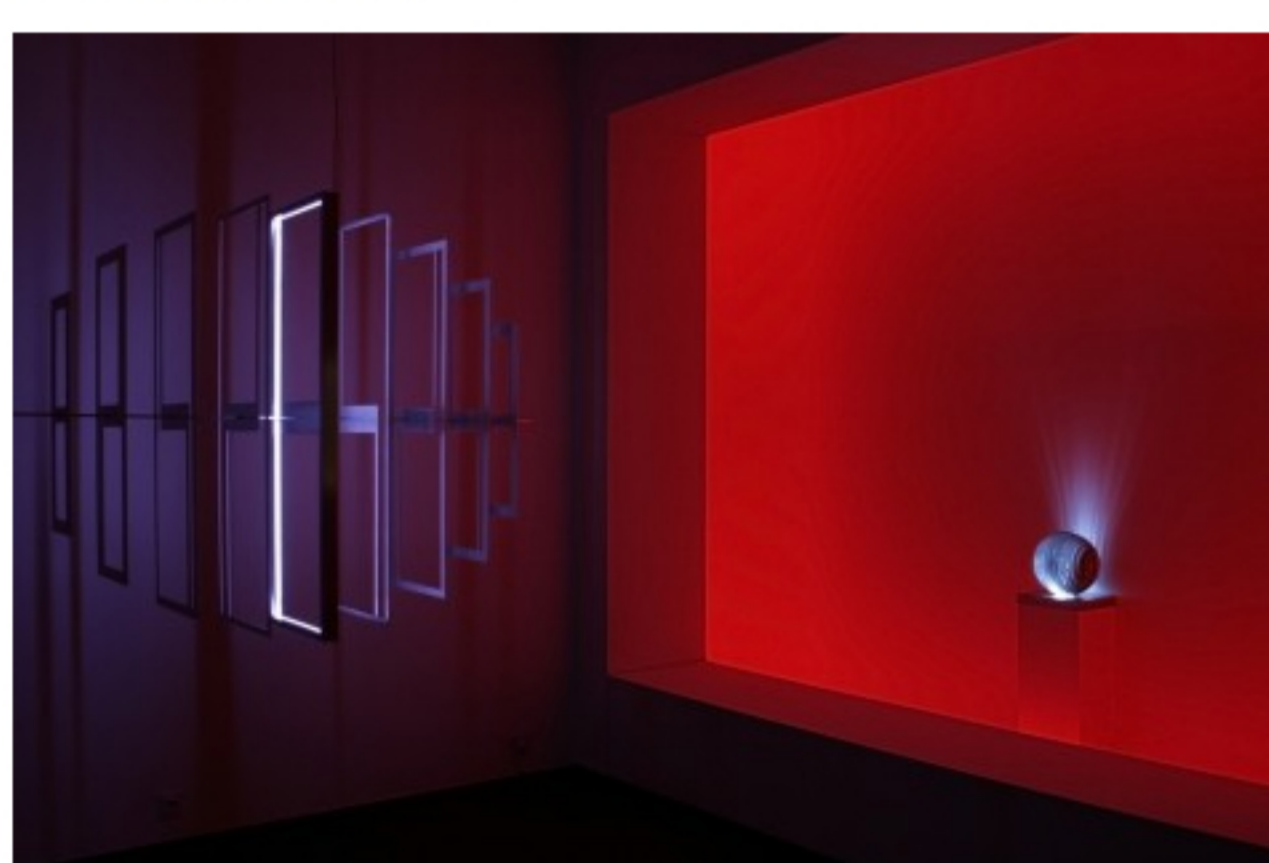


BARDULA STUDIO LIGHT EXHIBITION AT KKDC PARIS GALLERY

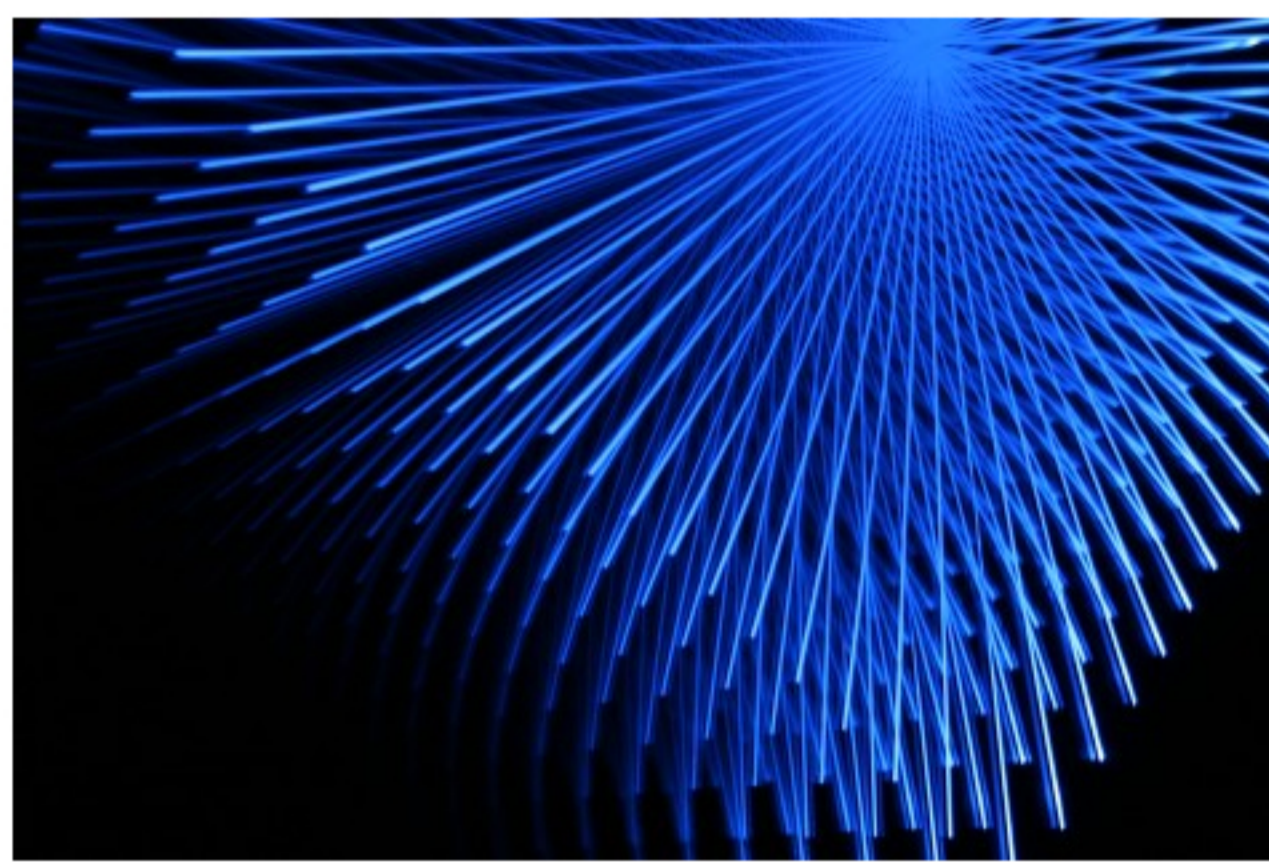


BARDULA STUDIO LIGHT EXHIBITION- KKDC Paris invites Bardula Studio to showcase a selection of recent works which uses LED light as medium. The exhibition takes place until December 3, 2015, at the KKDC gallery, 20 Passage Dauphine in the historical 6th arrondissement of Paris. This exhibition, between sculpture, jewellery, design and architecture, is made of abstract geometrical installations and light art. It reveals changing volumes, depending on perspective and LED colour. The entire space is an interaction between light, matter, reflections and volumes.



Next to the KKDC/OBUMEX showroom designed by French star architect Joseph Dirand, the KKDC gallery is an exhibition space dedicated to light. This space is offered to light artists and designers, who can use it to express their own creativity as long as it is inspired by light :

- a creative place to showcase the most innovating ideas, mirroring the light products conceived and manufactured by KKDC.
- a place of partnership where the principle of sharing ideas between a manufacturer and an artist is the essence of the spirit of the KKDC gallery. KKDC opens its doors to emerging as well as established artists.
- a place of display for the pedestrians to see, in this street shaded with trees and secluded from time. It is an ode to light, creativity and boldness, and of crossing boundaries.

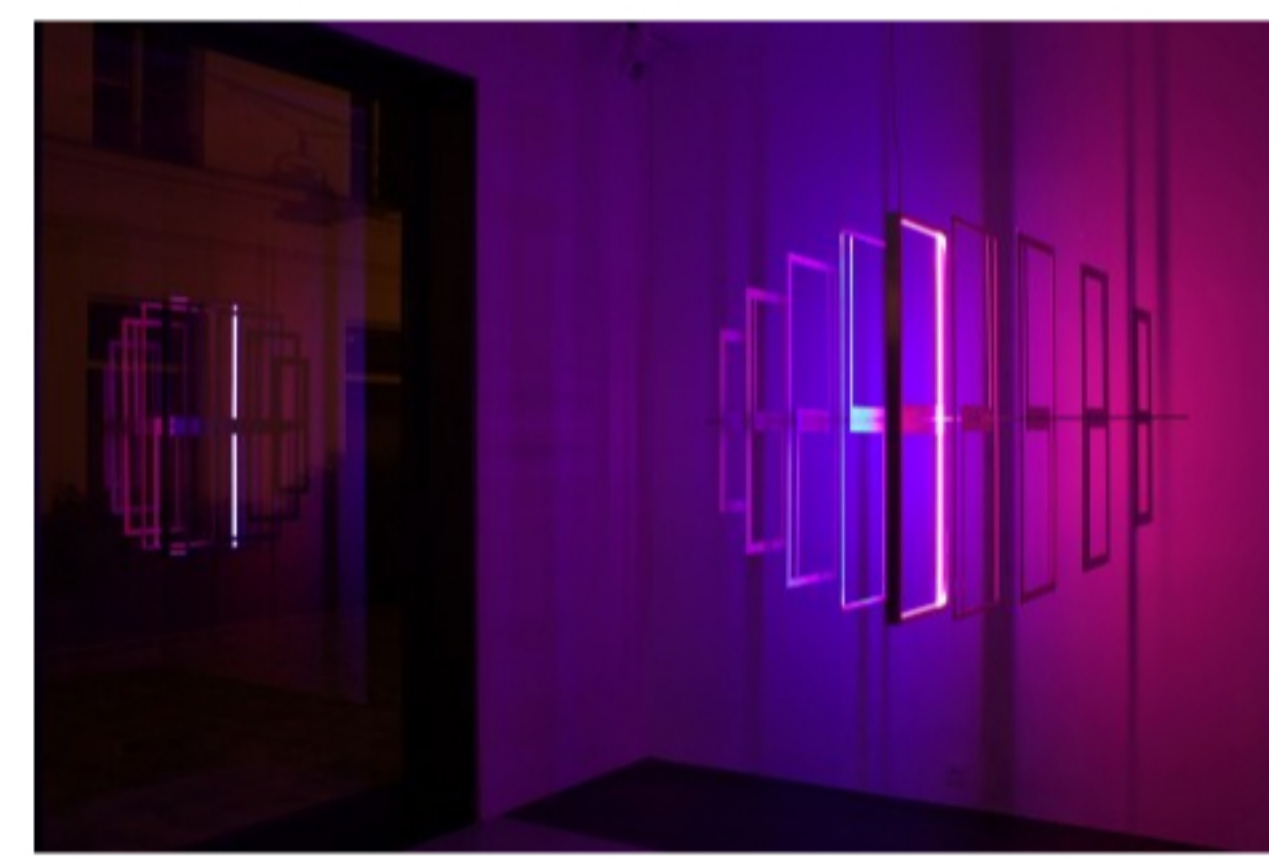

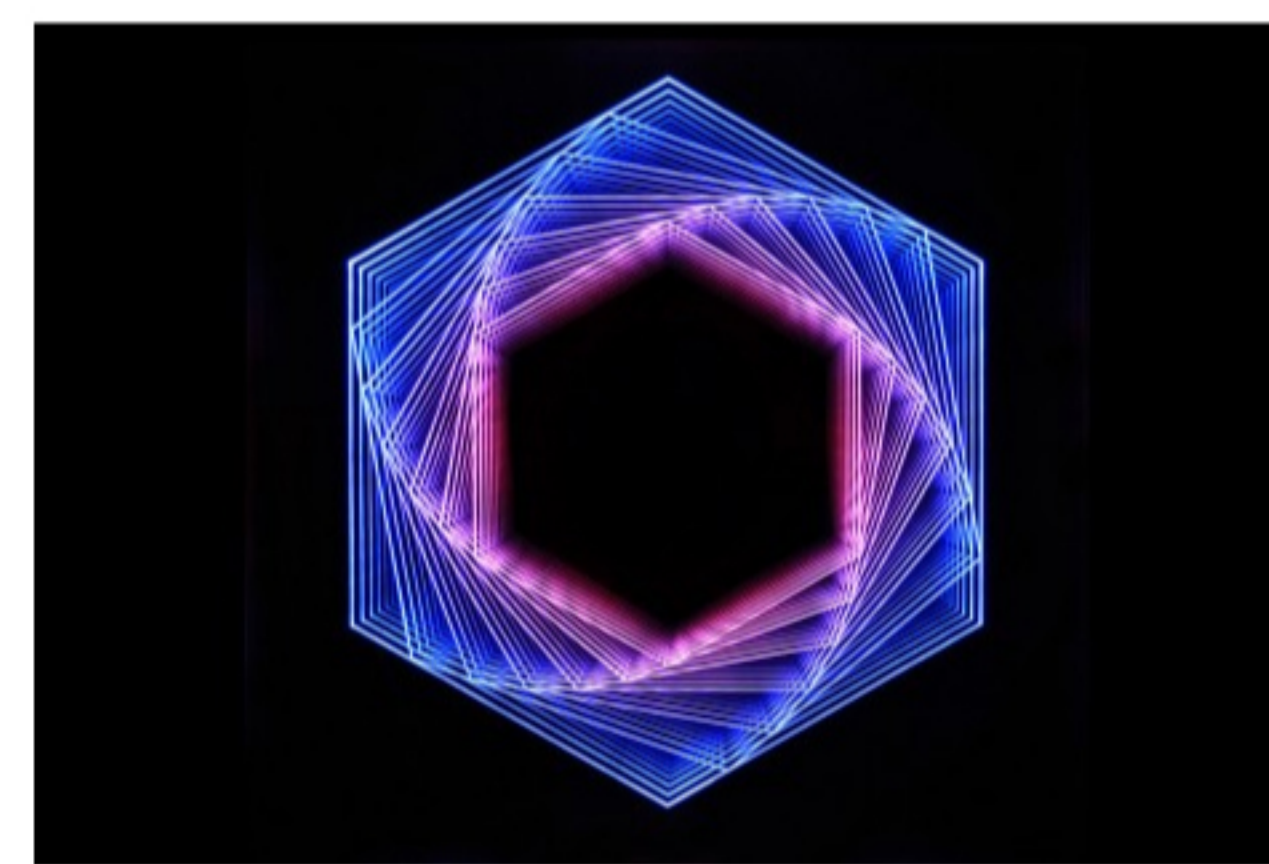
Xcube

An aerial installation, uses light to build a volume inspired par its wave-like nature, which is found in the shapes of the laser-cut brushed aluminium.



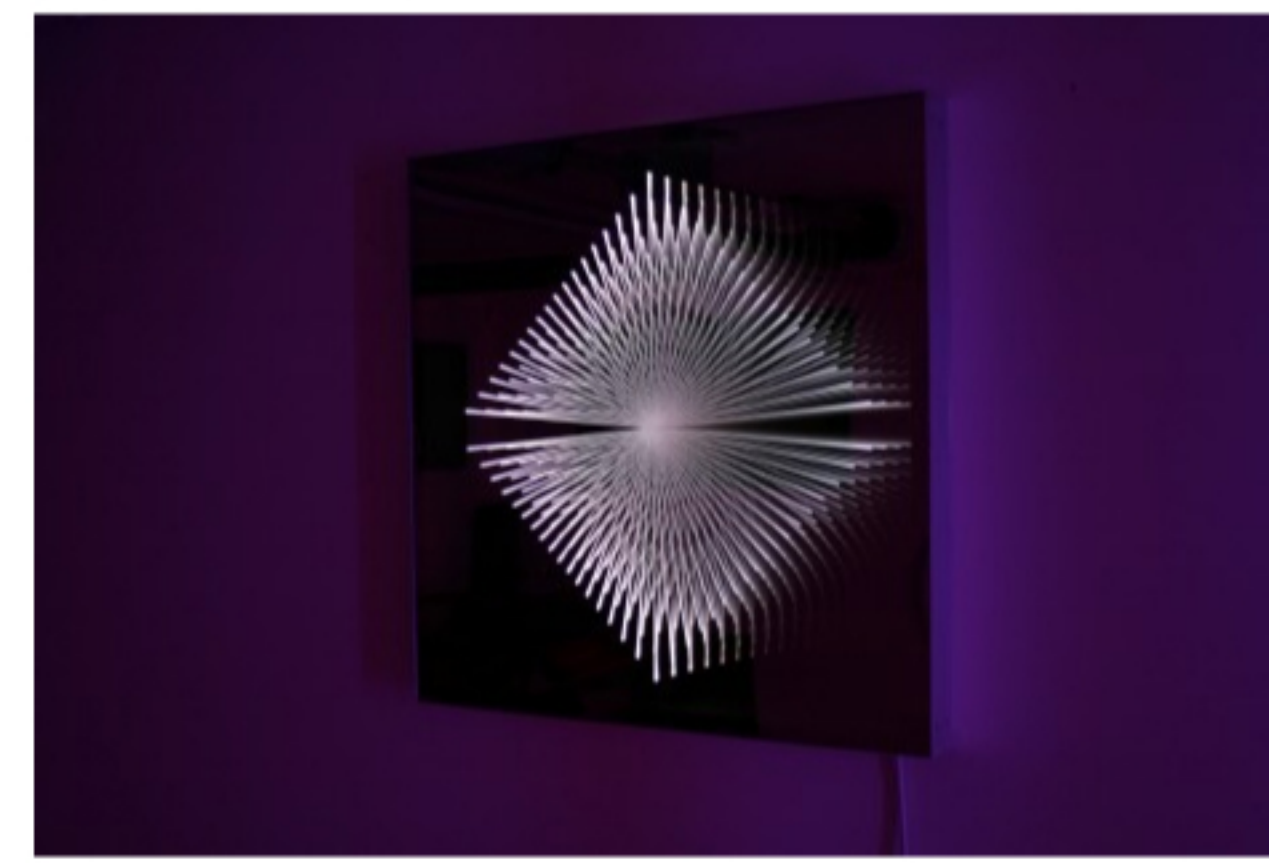
Hexagon and Hyperspace

Made of mirrors, where the captured light spread into an infinite reflection : the repetition of a two-dimensional picture gives the impression of a perspective that extends into the wall, beyond the mirror.



Hexagone II and Square I

Made of backlit translucent prints, where the lines follow an helical mathematical progression and create an optical illusion.



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
